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Subject:-

Minutes of the meeting held under the Chairmanship of Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir on 23-12-2013 regarding regularization of extraction of sand/bajri/boulders/river bed material from nallahs/streams/rivers.

There were various complaints and public representations related to unabated, unmindful and dangerous extraction of river bed material from various streams/nallahs/rivers in the Kashmir Division in general and Rembiara mathem in particular.

To discuss the issues related to extraction of sand/baj i/boulders, iver bed material/nallah muck from nallahs/streams/rivers especially in the backdurp of the complaints received with regard to extraction of material from Runbiara Nallah running through Districts of Shopian and Pulwama, a meeting was held under the Chairmanship of Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir on 23-10-2013 at 2.00 per eat Deputy Commissioner's Office, Pulwama.

In addition to above, people engaged in extraction like truck/tipper/tractor owners, contractors, lease helders of Geology & Mining Department also participated.

At the outset, the Chair sought feedback from the participants with regard to the modus operandi adopted for alletment of site/collection of royalty/issuance of NOCs by different department/mode of extraction adopted by the contractor, etc. It was informed that Geology & Mining Department, after auction, issues contracts orders for extraction of sand/bajri/boulders/river bed material/nallah muck from millahs/streams/rivers in favour of the contractors who pay royalty to the department and the Department issues receipts for the same.

As far as allotment of site is concerned, it was intimated that the contractors select the site on their own and the extraction is done both manually and mechanically in an unscientific manner. It was also informed that comments (NOCs from Fisheries and Irrigation & Flood Centrol Departments are not sought by Goology & Mining Department, which has adversely affected the aquatic life and has also affected the nearby area converting it prope to flash floods/floods. In the nutshell it was observed that the environmental concerns are not addressed to suitably and adecuately by Geology & Mining Department and need for regulating this mechanism was felt

After threadbare discussions, the following decisions were taken:-

- 1. District Magastrates shall benceforth be the Nodal Officers for i suing the requisite NOCs for the purpose after obtaining comments from Irrigation & Flood Control and Fisheries Departments. Without NOC of District Magistrate, no quarrying on river/nallah site will be permated.
- 2. A team consisting of Executive Engineer, Flood Control: Assistant Director, Fisheries and Discrict Officer, Geology & Mining shall make a joint recee of the rivers/taltahs of the district and Executive Engineer, Flood Control shall identify the dry patches, available around receivable nallahs, and other suitable spots quantifying the extent of material in terms of sand/hajri/boulders/river bed material/hallah muck to be extracted approximately from such patches/spots and thereafter Geology & Mining Department shall put on auction the said spots based on the calculations against the admissible royalty. A mechanism shall also be evolved/worke I out by the Geology & Mining Department to ensure that the material extracted from the identified spots only and to the extent estimated by the authorities of Flood Centrol Department purely in a scientific manner in due consultation with Flood Control Department and not otherwise. Mechanical means be used at such

places explicitly permitted for mechanical extraction by the Flood Control Department and all other places/spots be exploited in unually only.

- 3. Clear cut demarcation of the sites will be made by the Geology & Mining Department. A signboard giving details of the successful older and quantity to be extracted by the bidder will have to be installed for general information to the public and stakeholders.
- 4. Check Posts shall be erected/raised by Geology Miring Department at suitable places to ensure collection of permissible royalty from the concerned for the genuine loads. District Officer. Geology & Mining shall deposit the same in the Govt. Chest under relevant Account Head, and in case of any deviation, he/she shall be squarely responsible.
- 5. The extraction of the material shall be carried out at the identified from 8.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m., beyond which period no one shall be allewed be extract the materia and any person found indulging in illegal practices shall be proceeded against the Flood Control Department/Geology & Mining Department/Concerned Police Station.
- 6. Restrictions, under Section 144 of Cr. P.C., shall be imposed by the District Magistrates prohibiting the extraction of building material beyond, the permussible time and for regulation of the extraction operation.
- 7. No other department, except Geology & Mining Department shall be authorized to collect the royalty from the genuine contractor for the permissible material as per norms. While making allotment, the department shall clearly mention about Do's and Fon'ts related to the quarry operation.
- 8. The streams/sites notified by Fisheries Department will be prohibited from extraction of conscruction material.
- 9. No extraction shall be allowed 500 metres up/down of the bridges over the streams/bridges and 300 metres up/down brigation/PHE Schemes existing on the banks of the rivers.

10. Every department related to this extraction operation or otherwise shall take utmost care to save environment, ecology, flora-fauna and aquatic-biotic reserves of the area in general and around the quarrying site in particular. District Magistrates shall take suitable action against the violators u/s 133 Cr. P.C. and regulate it properly in their respective jurisdiction.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to and from the Chair.
