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Subject: Record note of the meeting regarding the committee constituted for implementation of the Scheme for Promotion of Traditional and Cultural Festivals of Jammu and Kashmir.

A meeting was held under the Chairmanship of Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir, Shri Pandurang K. Pole (IAS) on **01/01/2022 (Saturday) at 10:30 a.m.** in the Conference Hall of the **Office of Divisional Commissioner**, **Kashmir** for discussion and approval of the Action Plan for the "Scheme for Promotion of Traditional and Cultural Festivals of J&K" in Kashmir Division.

At the outset, Director, Archives, Archaeology and Museums, J&K briefed the committee about the scheme. He also presented to the Divisional Level Implementation Committee (DLIC) list of 12 festivals proposed from the respective districts for consideration and approval of the committee. He apprised the chair that each district of the Kashmir Division has been covered under the proposal.

Elucidating further, the Director, Archives, Archaeology and Museums informed the chair that the festivals have been categorized into three broader categories viz; Medium, Large, and Mega — by keeping a sum of Rs. 10 lacs, 20 lacs, and 40 lacs respectively for each festival in the respective category.

The DLIC accorded budgetary approval to the proposed list of events/festivals/activities to be covered in the last financial quarter of the year 2021-22. The names of approved events/festivals/activities are mentioned in Annexure – "A" to these minutes.

The chair was informed that the schedule / names / venues of the festivals are subject to change based on obtaining ground situation / local climatic conditions and other relevant factors. The committee unanimously authorized the implementing

agency i.e. JKAACL to effect modifications in schedule / date & venue as per requirement of each event / festival.

The possibility of a tangible-asset-generation under the scheme at the respective venues was also discussed. The DLIC suggested creation of a WhatsApp Group for further communication/coordination amongst the members. After threadbare discussion; the following decisions were taken:

- 1. Final budgetary allocation for holding of cultural activities/events/festivals under the scheme during the fourth quarter of 2021-22 was approved by the DLIC.
- On the suggestion of some of the members, the DLIC approved holding of Nauroz festival in Shopian and Budgam districts concurrently with major festivities allowed to be held in Budgam district on the proposed / scheduled date.
- 3. The DLIC approved release of funds by the Archives, Archeology, and Museums Department in favour of JKAACL against the Action Plan proposed by the Academy for each event/activity/festival with the Academy being granted liberty to effect slight modifications in action plan, wherever required.
- 4. The DLIC unanimously decided that all activities/events/festivals under the scheme will be executed by the JKAACL, for which necessary funding will be provided by the Archives, Archeology, and Museums Department from time to time.
- 5. For proper coordination among various stakeholders, the Divisional Commissioner nominated Additional Commissioner Kashmir as Divisional Level Coordinator for coordination with the Divisional Level Teams constituted by the Academy.
- 6. It was also decided that a District Level Coordinator in each district will be nominated by the District Administration for coordination with the District Level Teams constituted by the Academy.
- It was further resolved that experts from the DLIC shall assist the Academy (JKAACL) in making detailed proposals for the events/festivals/activities, wherever required.
- 8. The chair directed Director, Archives, Archaeology and Museums to share action plan for calendar year 2022 by or before 15th February, 2022 for consideration of the committee.
- The DLIC directed that after successful completion of activities/events/festivals, the JKAACL shall furnish actual expenditure statements, as per GFR / other relevant norms, to the Archives, Archeology, and Museums Department for record and reference.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to and from the Chair.
