DIVISIONAL COMMISSIONER, KASHMIR, SRINAGAR

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To review the level of preparedness in case of any eventuality due to adverse weather conditions, a meeting under the Chairmanship of Shri Baseer Ahmad Khan, IAS, Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir on 07.07.2018 at 5.00 P.M. at Hari Niwas, Srinagar to take stock of the readiness of the departments.

At the onset the Chair reiterated that the departments shall not be complacent by the prevalent better weather conditions and readiness for meeting any eventuality has to be maintained at the present level at least till 17th of this month as there is adverse weather forecast on that day and no let-up will be tolerated in this regard.

For this purpose, the services of Water Master provided by LAWDA are being utilized. He further informed that tendering has been initiated for 14 spots out of 25 spots identified by the respective Deputy Commissioners for strengthening on the embankments of lidder, bringee, Rambiara and veshaw nallahs. Further, work has been started at 6 places out of the 14 tendered critical spots as mentioned above. He further informed that 01lac 76 thousand sand bags have been filled till date to be utilized for strengthening of the weak spots in case of eventuality. Further, C E I&FC informed that the work on temporary plugging of the sluice point at Pandrathen and army tank is going on and will be completed within 03 days.</p>	<p>The Chair directed C E I&FC to continue the strengthening of the embankment at Lasjan.
